1. GENERAL

Kosovo Association of Information and Communication Technology- STIKK founded and registered as NGO, according to the Law for free association No. 03 / L-134, on 08 November 2008 with registration Number 5112067-1. STIKK's fiscal number is 600086814 taken on 05 November 2009 and VAT (Value Added Tax) number 330157885.

The organisation is domiciled in Rexhep Mala 28a (Building of ICK) Pristina Kosovo, in Prishtina, Kosovo and had 8 employees in full time, (8 average during 2014) as of 31 December 2014.

STIKK is founded to:

- promote the joint and convergent interests of the businesses of information and communication technologies in Kosovo , and the professional individuals.
- help in long growth of the businesses of information and communication technologies in Kosovo.
- upgrade the environment of the businesses of information and communication technologies in Kosovo.
- promote the contribution of the information and communication technologies in economic progress and growth in Kosovo.
- intends to be part of the development and implementation of the policies in Kosovo by helping the Government and Kosovo institutions in understanding the trend of actual and future technologies and to see how the technologies can contribute to the economic growth of Kosovo.

The governing bodies of the NGO are: Assembly of NGO, Board of Directors and Executive Director.

Assembly is the highest body of the NGO that is gathered once per year. Board has the regular meetings every three months. The board decides about the policies and activities of the STIKK.

Assets, revenues and the profit of the organization will be used to support the organizations non profitable targets and activities, no asset, revenue or profit will be used to create special individual benefits

STIK Members

IN 2014, 6 new companies have joined STIKK: Rikon, Epaytech, Eltring shpk, Trigonomi, Meduza and Ameble, bringing the total number to 42 company members. Now, STIKK has 114 members (42 companies, 17 professionals, 48 students, and 7 academic institutions). During 2014, membership has been paid by 42 companies or 36.84%, 17 professionals or 14.91%, and 48 students or 42.10%.

STIKK MAIN ACTIVITIES DURING YEAR 2014

During 2014, STIKK has held these activities, which are in accordance with its objectives:

Objective 1. Create conducive legislative and policy environment for a rapid development of the ICT sector

Regarding objective 1, STIKK has held important meetings ranging from the Prime Minister, Mr. Hashim Thaci, who visited STIKK in April 2014; Mr. Bujar Kelmendi, Legislative and Counselling Sector Leader of the Kosovo Customs; Mr. Blerand Stavileci, Economic Development Minister, etc. The STIKK staff also participated in different seminars and roundtables, which had as an objective a better life for Kosovar citizens.

A very important factor for STIKK's success in 2014 was the creative approach that has been offered in order to improve and create more opportunities for business-making in the ICT sector. Exemption of ICT goods from custom taxes, Kosovo ICT market analysis, ICT skills gap analysis, are just some of the many contributions of STIKK.

Objective 2. Human resource development consistent with the ICT sector demands

Through the STIKK Training Academy a great number of trainings have been organised with topics like: Sales management, promotion and marketing, customer relationship management, "Kosovo Young Coders", networking, IT basics, WomInnovation, and many others. These trainings have offered know-how from different areas of IT for different categories of citizens, where often the activities were focused on marginalised groups, such as females in IT and youngsters.

STIKK has also created a platform for experience and opportunity exchange. This mainly happened through the job fair - "Your carrier on track", the American Chamber of Commerce job fair, Business Tuesday, etc. In addition to that, STIKK continued signing agreements with different important partners, such as the British Council regarding the training for Androld, Social Media Management, and Internet Marketing.

Objective 3. Provide services to members, with a view on creating new business opportunities

STIKK has offered to its members a variety of activities, where worth mentioning are the information session for participation in HORIZON2020 with focus on ICT, the Open Government Partnership workshop, the IT export strategy workshop for South-East Europe, the "Diaspora Women in Business" forum, etc. In particular, the participation of STIKK and its members on CeBIT 2014 is considered as a great success.

Besides the above mentioned points and their great importance, the KosICT 2014 conference is one of the most important pillars of success for STIKK and ICK. The three days conference has resulted in 200 participants, who were IT professionals that gathered to discuss about the newest trends in this field.

Last but not least, the B2B event "Nearshoring Kosovo" was very important. This activity was organised by STIKK in cooperation with ICK and the Austrian Chamber of Commerce. In this activity, five Austrian companies and companies from Kosovo have presented their businesses and have identified the opportunities for partnership in the future. A similar B2B activity has been offered during KosICT 2014, where German and Norwegian companies participated.

Objective 4. Creating conditions for a sustainable activity of the STIKK

Regarding this objective, the following activities have been organized. In the month of July, for the fifth time the National Albanian Day of Information and Communication Technology was organized in Prizren by STIKK and AITA; GIZ donated 4 Pin Boards, through which Project Team Manager of GIZ in Kosovo, Ms. Veronika Hofinger, congratulated STIKK for the work that has been accomplished; Media coverage of the "Young Coders Kosovo" project and the visit from Prishtina's Mayor, Mr. Shpend Ahmeti.

In April, the 6th annual assembly was held, where the achievement and outcomes of the year 2013 were presented to the participants by the Executive Director, Ms. Vjollca Çavolli. Additionally to this, the statute was approved, and new STIKK board members were appointed by the participants. STIKK also participated in the roundtable with the topic "Usage of social media in the communication municipality-citizen", in public consultations and presentation of the IPA II programme - Cross-border cooperation 2014-2020 Kosovo - Former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia (FYROM); and the last two drafting workshops of the National IT Strategy were organized.

In order to ensure maximum professionalism, STIKK delegated staff members to take part in different trainings and activities. A high number of these activities were trainings about advocacy, lobbying, project proposal writing, one workshop about the ICT export strategy in Sarajevo (Bosnia and Herzegovina). In the end, STIKK organized fun activities, such as the New Year party on 19 of December, which is a STIKK and ICK tradition. Another point worth mentioning is that STIKK offered a presentation to the Serb community, where inclusion in the ICT industry has been promoted in front of students and professionals.

Objective 5. Support members in exercising social responsibility of the ICT sector

Considering the social aspect, STIKK offered contribution in various ways. In April, the Blood Donation day was organised, and besides STIKK, ICK, and Athene staff, contributions were made also from member companies. In September, the Blood Donation tradition continued, where the ICK incubation teams and representatives from STIKK member companies were part of it.

On a different note, STIKK also contributed in the drafting of the Strategic Plan for Protecting Children from Online Risks.

2. BASIS OF PREPARATION OF STATEMENTS AND ACCOUNTING PRINCIPLES

2.1. Accounting Convention

The statement has been prepared on the accrual basis. On this basis, income is recognized when earned and expenses are recognized when incurred.

The Financial Report has been prepared by the STIKK, which keeps records in Accounting Software "Quick Books".

2.2. Reporting currency

Funds are received in Euro whereas expenses are sustained in Euro (Kosovo currency). The Financial Report is expressed in Euro, into which is presented the currencies used by the Project in its operations. Transactions in currencies other than Euros are translated into Euros at the relevant exchange rate ruling on the date of the transaction.

2.3. Tax

In accordance with the Framework-Contract, the Projects are exempt from income tax. Taxation is provided in accordance with Kosovo fiscal regulations and is currently calculated at the appointed level of taxable income. The Projects is liable for personnel and social taxes and withholding tax on income according to the Kosovo Regulation.

2.4. Comparatives

Certain comparative figures have been restated to conform to current year presentation due to change of the reporting method from cash basis in accrual basis.

2.5. Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash and highly liquid bank deposits with an original maturity of three months or less.

2.6. Fixed assets

Fixed assets are stated at cost, less accumulated depreciation. All equipment and other fixed assets are capitalized as fixed assets rather than expensed. Depreciation is provided on a straight-line basis at the following annual rates:

For purchases on second half of the year depreciation was calculated 50% of annual rate, according to the new Law applied from 01.01.2010.

2.7. Receivables

Receivables are stated at their net realizable value.

2.8. Payables

Payables represent amounts due in relation to expenses recognized on a accrual basis. Payables are stated at cost. As at 31 December 2014, outstanding payables related to utilities, tax on rent, office salaries, social contributions and employment taxes.

2.9. Income

Funds received are derived principally from different donators. The donations are recognized as deferred revenue when received. Other income is also recorded when earned rather than when received.
